





Ahmad and Gohar Shabanifard





2:06:26 pm, on Wednesday 20th March just gone, marked the precise moment of the beginning of the 13-day celebration of the age-old Persian New Year: Nowrooz ('new day'), that special time of sacred renewal for Persian families and their friends all across the world, festivities which, interestingly, have always embraced the Christian Easter period.

Ahmad (respectful) and his wife, Gohar (jewel), remain very much an engaged part of that wide-spread diaspora, and after having made Woodlands their home in May of 2022. Naturally, they reserve great pride and respect for their traditions. But so too for their Christian faith and for Australia itself, given all the opportunities now available to them in their new lives here. The chance to reunite with their daughter and grand-son, Sara and Sam (Sara having come in 2012), was what chiefly brought them from Iran; but so too Gohar's sister and family, given that they had arrived way back in 1989. Those family bonds are strong, of course, and their family gatherings are frequent.

A retired high school teacher of sociology, family is a key driving force for Gohar, as might be expected. But so too for Ahmad, a most thoughtful and friendly individual whose work and studies had taken him outside Iran a number of times in years gone by. Though a devotee of Persian literature and philosophy (especially the teachings of Rumi, Molana), he is also a student of the wider world's wisdom and often enjoys discussing a wealth of matters concerning the human condition.

However, Ahmad brings other highly specialised knowledge and skills to the Woodlands community as well, for he is an experienced, gifted, and meticulous craftsman with a huge collection of watches, clocks, jewellery components, and various bits-and-pieces. As such, he is more than happy to make his repair services readily available to everyone at Woodlands. And he assures us that he will do so at minimal cost.


